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# ARTHRITIS ALLIANCE OF CANADA 2ND ANNUAL CONFERENCE AND RESEARCH SYMPOSIUM

"Arthritis Unmasked: Genetics, Treatments and Partnerships"

Toronto Marriott Downtown Eaton Centre Hotel October 31-November 1, 2014 the AAC, in collaboration with the Gairdner Foundation and the Canadian Institutes of Health Research Institute of Musculoskeletal Health and Arthritis (CIHR-IMHA) brought together close to 300 arthritis

researchers, clinicians, healthcare experts, and people living with arthritis. The event, titled "Arthritis Unmasked: Genetics, Treatments and Partnerships" shared the latest in research and program developments impacting the over 4.6 million Canadians living with arthritis. The future of arthritis care, prevention and cures was the focus of the three-day program, some highlights include:

The Friday, October 31st agenda featured the celebration of Sirs Ravinder Maini and Marc Feldmann. Their landmark discovery led to the creation of a new class of medications called "biologics", treatments which can modulate the process of the inflammatory response in the body's autoimmune system, effectively halting the progress of joint damage, pain and inflammation. Friday's program also highlighted presentations from prominent national and international researchers: Dr. Peter Gregersen (New

She believes that

#### Arthritis Society issues annual call for research

In line with a five-year research strategy that ends in 2020, The Arthritis Society this month announced its Strategic Operating Grants Competition for 2015-16. Canada's brightest researchers are invited to submit research proposals under this year's theme of "Improving our understanding of arthritis and finding the cure."



It's meant to unearth novel ideas in the areas of alleviating pain, preventing or slowing disease progression, restoring joint function, and ultimately curing arthritis for those who live with it. This year includes a commitment to fund at least one project that studies the potential of medical cannabis toward these goals. The Society will fund up to six applications in total, up to \$120,000 annually for one to three years. It will also focus on emerging talent in the field by opening the annual Young Investigator Operating Grant Competition as well as the Young Investigator Salary award.
