CENTRE HOSPITALIER UNIVERSITAIRE DE QUÉBEC

The Early Arthritis Screening and Treatment (EAST) program was implemented at the CHU de Québec with the aim to increase the number of persons with early arthritis seen within the recommended guidelines. The triage clinic team (physiotherapists, nurse, rheumatologists and residents) started seeing patients in September 2013 and we are documenting our progress for a report due in early 2015. However, we know that we have not been able to impact significantly on our waiting list because of the constant pressure from the new referrals and follow-ups. This has forced us to rethink the whole trajectory of care for our arthritis patients. Inspired by the AAC Model of Care, the CHU de Québec has formed an Advisory Committee on arthritis care that will make recommendations and provide assistance to implement a new care trajectory at the CHU de Québec.

THE ARTHRITIS PROGRAM

The Arthritis Program (TAP) at Southlake Regional Health Centre in Newmarket, Ontario is an award winning interprofessional, patient centred Model of Care. With the support of the Canadian Initiative for Outcomes in Rheumatology Care (CIORA), the

TAP-Interprofessional Training Program (TAP-ITP) was developed in response to interest among clinicians wishing to foster their own team growth using the TAP model. Training program pilot outcomes from 14 teams across Canada demonstrate sustained improvement in knowledge, skills and attitudes related to interprofessional care.

In January 2014, The Arthritis Program - Interprofessional Training Program (TAP-ITP) was delivered to the Edmonton Rheumatology Program at Alberta Health Services. Over 20 clinicians (rheumatologists, nurses, physical therapists, occupational therapists & pharmacist), managers and support personnel spent two days engaging in team development and dialogue to create





a common vision for arthritis care. Edmonton Rheumatology has earned a reputation as a comprehensive, quality program, offering a range of clinics and services to patients in Edmonton, Northern Alberta and beyond. The workshop fostered growth and appreciation among the participants, enabling the team to further their journey together on the road to success!

screening tool developed from Dr. Marra's research work in pharmacy. His research showed that a simple, easy-to-administer questionnaire was as accurate at detecting osteoarthritis of the knee as an MRI, and is cost-saving to the healthcare system.
