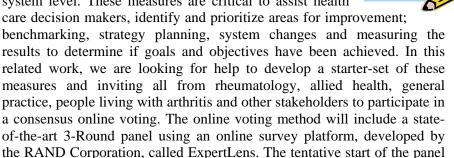

Arthritis Consumer Experts is Looking for Canada's Best Workplace for Employees Living with Arthritis

Arthritis is the most common cause of work disability in Canada and typically occurs during prime working years, between ages 35-50. The impact of arthritis costs the Canadian economy more than \$6.4 billion annually. Lost workdays due to long-term disability account for approximately two-thirds of this total. One in six Canadians has osteoarthritis (OA). That number is expected to rise to 1 in 3 Canadians by 2020. One out of every 136 Canadian workers lives with rheumatoid arthritis (RA), but that will increase to 1 in 68 workers by 2020. Within ten years of the onset of RA, up to 50% of employees living with RA are work disabled if left under- or un-treated. YOUR INPUT IS NEEDED!

The Canadian Arthritis Patient Alliance (CAPA) seeks input to update the Arthritis Bill of Rights and Responsibilities. The Bill of Rights and Responsibilities represented the first time the arthritis community worked together towards creating a document used to lobby (government and insurers) for access to new medications and encouraged patients to continue advocating for their rights. With support from the Ontario Rheumatology Association and input from partner organizations, CAPA will update the Bill and call it the Arthritis Patient Charter. With input and cooperation of all arthritis stakeholders, the most valuable and relevant document will result. The final document will reside on the CAPA website and be pointed to by CAPA's partner organizations through their websites. It will be also printed on rack cards and posters that will be found in your healthcare providers' offices.

XELJANZ (tofacitinib citrate) - the first new oral rheumatoid arthritis (RA) medicine in more than 10 years is now available in Canada

XELJANZ, in combination with methotrexate (MTX), is indicated for reducing the signs and symptoms of RA, in adult patients with moderately to severely active RA who have had an inadequate response to MTX. In cases of intolerance to MTX, physicians may consider the use of XELJANZ as monotherapy. The eXelTM program will be available free of charge for individuals prescribed XELJANZ to help them explore their financial options, facilitate access and manage their RA on a daily basis.

ALBERTA INNOVATES-HEALTH SOLUTIONS TEAM in OSTEOARTHRITIS

Alberta Team OA is an interdisciplinary team with a novel approach to OA care, integrated knowledge translation, and policy implementation with a proven and highly functional team of national and international experts, overseen by an eight member International Advisory Board (IAB). The OA



Team has grown into a group of 55 investigators and 60 trainees with unique engagement of patients as drivers and end-users. Over the past year, key team outputs included:

- 238 published peer-reviewed journal articles (52 with trainees as first authors, 92 with 2 or more OA Team members as co-authors)
- 288 published abstracts
- 129 invited and 159 peer- reviewed presentations
- 83 outreach activities
- \$5,479,087 of annual leveraged funds, and
- 7 technology transfer activities (e.g. patents).
