On September 9th, the Province of British Columbia announced a \$3 million grant to advance the work of the Arthritis Research Centre of Canada (ARC). This funding will be directed towards helping ARC reduce work disability, improve pain management, minimize health care costs, and meet the special needs of more than 600,000 British Columbians living with arthritis. With over 100 different forms of arthritis, and a leading cause of disability, it is estimated this condition costs the B.C. health care system roughly \$1.6 billion annually. Bone and Joint Canada is pleased to announce the release of a report "Reducing the Impact of Osteoarthritis (OA) in Canada, opportunities for prevention and management." During the past year, BJC has undertaken an initiative to identify the evidence-based strategies that will support prevention, early diagnosis and effective management of OA and has worked with the partners in OA from across the country to start to develop an action plan that will support the implementation of the effective strategies across the spectrum of the disease. The recommendations include working together to improve coordination of services, including the partnerships between the healthcare and the health and wellness sectors, and to develop a repository of information on effective programs for managing OA across the country.
