ALBERTA BONE AND JOINT HEALTH INSTITUTE (ABJHI) Dr. Martin Ferguson-Pell Appointed Executive Director of ABJHI

Dr. Martin Ferguson-Pell has been appointed Executive Director of Alberta Bone and Joint Health Institute, effective immediately. As ABJHI's senior executive, Dr. Ferguson-Pell assumes responsibility for setting strategic objectives, building productive, mutually beneficial relationships with stakeholders in bone and joint health care, and securing the resources ABJHI requires to meet its long-term priorities. Dr. Ferguson-Pell is Vice-principal, Peter Lougheed Leadership College, Vice-provost (Strategic Initiatives), and Professor in Rehabilitation Medicine at the University of Alberta. He will continue in these positions while serving as ABJHI's Executive Director. Dr. Ferguson-Pell is a biomedical engineer and credentialed clinical scientist. His academic career has centred on studying secondary complications of physical disability and their causes to reduce their incidence.



Prior to his appointment as Vice-principal, Dr. Ferguson-Pell was Senior Advisor to the university's President tasked with quickly completing several key initiatives. These included undertaking a major review of graduate education and experience, advancing leadership in digital learning, and establishing presidential review committees.

ARTHRITIS CONSUMER EXPERTS

ACE, along with its ICON (Dr. Linda Li, PI) Knowledge User Group partners, the Canadian Association for Retired Persons and the Alzheimer's Society of B.C., is nearing the launch pad for the "Walk 10 Blocks" (W10B) mobile app. Presented at the May 2015 AAC membership meeting, the W10B project is one of the OA MoC initiatives aimed at raising awareness around the need to sit less and walk more. Brain health and arthritis research (Liu-Ambrose, Li) shows that walking 10 blocks (about 2,000-3,000 steps or 1 km each day) lowers the risk of dementia, and also has potential to improve cardiovascular, arthritis and bone health. The W10B app beta will study how effective it is at encouraging users to stand up and walk and track the number of steps and blocks walked.

It will also survey users several times during the beta test to ascertain user feedback and behavior change. In two weeks time you will receive an invitation from ACE to install the app on your iPhone (models 5s and 6, with iOS 8 installed) and take part in our beta project. We hope all Alliance members with iPhones will take part in the W10B project. Thank you!



This salary award was designed to support investigation in inflammatory arthritis (IA) aligned with the research pillars of the CIORA grant program—getting more patients with IA diagnosed, utilizing multidisciplinary care teams to deliver high-quality arthritis services, and advancing educational initiatives.

ADVANCED CLINICIAN PRACTITIONER IN ARTHRITIS CARE (ACPAC) PROGRAM

The directors of the ACPAC Program extend their congratulations to the 7 graduates (2 OT/5 PT) who successfully graduated from the University of Toronto's ACPAC Program in June, 2015. The 2014-2015 cohort included 1 trainee from BC, 2 from Alberta and 4 from Ontario. At this time we also welcome 9 new trainees into the 2015-2016 program which begins on October 19, 2015. This cohort includes 3 RNs and 6 PTs with one trainee coming from Saskatchewan, one from Newfoundland, and 7 from across Ontario.



The ACPAC Program is celebrating its ability to attract excellent candidates from coast to coast. We are proud of the ACPAC Program in its effort to reach out at a national level and to improve new models of arthritis care across Canada through human health resource development.

THE CANADIAN NETWORK FOR ADVANCED INTERDISCIPLINARY METHODS (CANRAD)

The CANRAD Network team includes a variety of decision makers, epidemiologists, clinicians and researchers interested in the use of administrative data for rheumatic disease research. We are organizing a fall or winter webinar to showcase the work of our team. For

The CAnadian Network for Advanced Interdisciplinary Methods for comparative effectiveness research' (CAN-AIM) team was funded by CIHR to develop novel methods using prospective



longitudinal cohorts and to respond to key knowledge gaps regarding drug safety and effectiveness by answering queries which arise from Health Canada and other regulatory parties. Our demonstration project looked at the comparative effectiveness of anti-tumour necrosis factor (TNF) agents versus traditional disease-modifying agents (DMARDs) in reducing orthopaedic surgery in rheumatoid arthritis (RA). ONTARIO RHUEMATOLOGY ASSOCIATION Update on the ORA MOC and EMR

Access to Specialist Care

The Allied Health Rheumatology Triage project is ongoing with over 90 patients participating. The study examines the role of specially trained extended role-practioners working in a triage role to improve access for people with suspected IA.

Knowledge Translation Program

A slide deck program has been developed by the ORA MOC working committee and will soon be available to all Rheumatologists. Content/learning will be dialogued at regional sessions and facilitated by local rheumatology champions. Stay tuned for more details.

Meaningful use and Optimization with EMRs

- The EMR committee continues to work with Ontario EMRs to develop rheumatology specific tools and support work-flow efficiencies. Rheumatology specific packages are now available and training sessions are scheduled for rheumatologists/office staff: Oscar Training TBD; Accuro Training: August 14 and August 21st Space is still available. Please email scouto@uhnresearch.ca for more details. A fall training workshop will be scheduled for those unable to attend one of the August dates.
- The Ontario Best Practice Research Initiative (OBRI), ORA EMR committee and IT experts have launched a pilot study to build and deploy a Rheumatic Diseases Multi-Registry (RDMR) platform that will securely integrate into rheumatology EMRs. The platform will work to seamlessly automate EMR data extraction which will be used for researchers and practice improvement dashboards for clinicians. OBRI is funding the pilot project and once completed will be made available to all rheumatologists participating in its initiative.
- → ORA representatives participated in a data harmonization meeting led by the Arthritis Alliance of Canada. The goal of the meeting was to discuss the development of a national framework to harmonize a core dataset from amongst the provincial databases; and agree on rheumatology indicators to be used within EMR platforms. The outcome of this session will plan for a larger stakeholder meeting during the AACs annual conference this coming fall.
