
Advocacy Efforts to Position Arthritis a National Priority

The Arthritis Alliance of Canada (AAC) has successfully completed the first round of nine introductory meetings with government representatives in Ottawa, February 22-24, in line with its strategic plan to work with governments across Canada to prioritize arthritis as a major health concern and priority for action. The AAC delegates met with the officials from Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC), Health Canada, Ministry of Employment, Workforce Development, and Labour, Ministry of Employment and Social Development, Ministry of Indigenous and Northern Affairs, Ministry for Families, Children and Social Development and Ministry of Sport and Persons with Disabilities.

The AAC continues its efforts on building relationships with the new Liberal government with a second round of meetings in Ottawa, end of March-April. Stay tuned for more information!

We need your involvement to position arthritis as a national priority, everyone has a role to play! To help us ensure a coordinated approach, please advise of any outreach you do and/or meetings with your local MP so that we can keep track and avoid sending multiple letters to the same person. As some of you may know, CAPA has launched a project on pregnancy and parenting with arthritis. A first step in the project was the development of a survey to identify patient information needs during these critical stages of life. CAPA Board Members, Laurie Proulx and Dawn Richards, presented a poster highlighting the survey findings at the annual Canadian Rheumatology Association (CRA) conference. The survey findings indicate that patients have a high need for information when considering pregnancy and in carrying out their role as parents. Issues identified by respondents include:

- medication safety during pregnancy and breastfeeding
- dealing with fatigue and flares
- physical care of children.



The CAnadian Network for Advanced Interdisciplinary Methods for comparative effectiveness research' (CAN-AIM) team was funded by CIHR to develop novel methods using prospective longitudinal cohorts and to respond to key knowledge gaps regarding drug safety and effectiveness by answering queries which arise from Health Canada and other regulatory parties. Our demonstration project looked at the comparative effectiveness of anti-tumour necrosis factor (TNF) agents versus traditional disease-modifying agents (DMARDs) in reducing orthopaedic
