

QUALITY IMPROVEMENTS IN MODELS OF CARE Developing an Osteoarthritis (OA) Tool for Primary Care

The OA Tool is in its final stage of development. The <u>College of Family Physicians of Canada</u> (CFPC) presented an update of the Tool at the April 13th <u>Arthritis Alliance of Canada</u> (AAC) Members Meeting in Toronto, during which participants provided valuable feedback. <u>Centre for Effective Practice</u> (CEP) is taking this feedback - along with inputs being gathered from recent Clinical Working Group and usability sessions with primary care practitioners – and are on track to delivering the final Tool in early May 2017. Once the French translation is completed, the AAC will jointly release the Tool with CFPC and CEP. Federal government preserves existing Access to Cannabis for Medical Purposes Regulations

<u>The Arthritis Society</u> and <u>Canadians for Fair Access to Medical Marijuana</u> (CFAMM) welcome the Federal government's decision to preserve the existing Access to Cannabis for Medical Purposes Regulations (ACMPR) within the new legislation for the legalization of cannabis in Canada announced in Parliament earlier this month.



This ensures that Canadians needing cannabis for medical purposes will be able to continue to obtain it, if they wish, through a separate, accessible, regulated system that is distinct from that for non-medical cannabis. However, other patient needs remain to be addressed in the negotiations with the provinces in the coming months. Read the <u>full statement here</u>.
