INFLAMMATORY ARTHRITIS (IA) MODELS OF CARE DEVELOPMENTS

Sharing Its Models of Care Work

The Arthritis Alliance of Canada showcased its Models of Care work at the 2017 Canadian Rheumatology Association (CRA) Annual Scientific Meeting & AHPA Annual Meeting in Ottawa.

The current pattern of health care delivery to those living with IA is not sustainable. The economic burden is expected to double within a generation, and the number of rheumatologists in Canada is already insufficient to provide timely care. The interactive session, entitled "Rheumatology Care Re-designed, Models of Care in Action: You can do it too!" showed participants how to apply practical clinical tool and work in shared care models to optimize the delivery of quality care for patients.



In the session, participants learned:

- what a model of care is and why it is important to them
 - the importance of evaluating models of care to inform quality improvements
- how to apply practical tools to improve practice; and
- understand how a collaborative team of health care professionals can optimize the delivery of care.

Three shared care models were demonstrated in a speed dating style format:

- 1) An ACPAC trained extended role provider led, Triage shared care model, by Ms. Tiffany Larsen, Advanced Physiotherapist Practitioner, Orangeville, Ontario
- 2) A Family Doctor supported shared care model, by Dr. Samuel Hickcox, G.P. Rheumatologist, G.P. Psychotherapist, Rheumatology Care, Halifax, Nova Scotia
- 3) An ACPAC trained extended role provider led, telemedicine supported shared care model, by Ms. Jocelyne Murdoch, Occupational Therapist, Sudbury, Ontario

Close to 70 attendees participated in this workshop and shared their appreciation for the knowledagble session. *Don't wait, just ACT! Research Posters released at CRA

This month, The Arthritis Society presented two research posters at the Annual Canadian Rheumatology Association conference:

• The Objective Gap: this poster displayed results from a survey conducted at CRA 2016 and via online outreach, which examined the gap between what rheumatologists evaluate as measurable outcomes of IA treatment, and what patients are looking for. • Factors Associated with Decisions to Transition to a Different Biologic, including Biosimilars: The Patients' Perspective: this poster displayed results from a pre-survey conducted with focus group participants, collecting the perspectives and needs of Canadians who take biologics for inflammatory diseases. The purpose was to understand their experience and perception of biologics and biosimilars, and the implications of switching medications. The full report from the project will be made available later this spring.

Both research posters were selected by the CRA Optimal Care Committee for their contributions to "Choosing Wisely and/or Quality Improvement."

Arthritis Consumer Experts (ACE) Third Annual Search for Canada's Best Workplaces for Employees Living with Arthritis

Arthritis Consumer Experts announced the winners of its third annual search for Canada's Best Workplaces for Employees Living with Arthritis. Based on workplace insights shared by employees and company managers, ACE awarded the City of Ottawa and Aboriginal Peoples Television Network for their arthritis awareness, prevention and benefits practices in the workplace.

Research at Arthritis Research Canada shows that workers with arthritis who have more flexible work arrangements, more autonomy on how they do their job and organize their schedule, and who have received job accommodations, are more productive at work and less likely to become work disabled This is reflected in the past three years of the Best Arthritis Workplaces program, where employees with arthritis have consistently told ACE that finding a workplace that supports job accommodation is a priority in their job choice, even at the expense of salary or advancement.

Canada's healthcare systems routinely collect large amounts of health information from patients. This information includes data on health and use of healthcare services, such as hospital visits, laboratory results, and prescription medications. This large amounts of health information is called "Big" Data.

This survey will gather Canadians' knowledge and opinions about using Big Data for research to help improve the delivery of healthcare in Canada.

This study is led by the Consumer Core of the PRECISION research team housed at Arthritis Research Canada. The Consumer Core project lead is Cheryl Koehn of Arthritis Consumer Experts, and the core members include the Gastrointestinal Society, Arthritis Patient Advisory Board, and the Canadian Skin Patient Alliance.

New Leading-edge Program Aims to Improve Physical Activity and Decrease Sitting Time in People with Knee Osteoarthritis

There is overwhelming evidence that being physically active can improve people's health and quality of life. Despite this, over 50% of people with arthritis are not physically active enough, even when their symptoms are under control. A new research study titled *SuPRA: Supporting Physical Activity and Reducing Sedentary Behavior in Arthritis* is actively recruiting participants to test a new program which combines educational sessions, an activity monitor and physical activity counselling to improve people's mobility and decrease sedentary time.

CIHR INSTITUTE OF MUSCULOSKELETAL HEALTH AND ARTHRITIS Announcement on Successful UCAN CAN-DU Network

CIHR Institute of Musculoskeletal Health and Arthritis congratulates Dr. Rae Yeung (Toronto's Hospital for Sick Children), and Prof. Nico Wulffraat (Utrecht University, The Netherlands), as recipients of an \$8 million grant from a Canada-Netherlands Personalized Medicine in Immune Mediated Inflammatory Musculoskeletal Disease network. Their international UCAN CAN-DU research team will analyze current biological therapies of arthritis for children and develop new ones without side effects. Results could lead to cost benefits and improved outcomes for children living with arthritis. The grant is made possible through a partnership between CIHR, ZonMw (the Netherlands Organization for Health Research and Development) and Reumafonds (the Dutch Arthritis Foundation).
