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ARTHRITIS ALLIANCE OF CANADA AAC 2018 Research Awards Program: Update

The Arthritis Alliance of Canada (AAC) is in the process of reviewing the applications for the 3rd round of Research Awards with <u>fifty-two (52) applications</u> received by July 31st, for the <u>eight award categories</u>, including: 1) Master Student, 2) PhD Student, 3) Post-doctoral fellow, 4) Early Career Researcher in Basic/Clinical Science, 5) Early Career Researcher in Health Science/Population Health, 6) Patient for Active Engagement in Arthritis Research, 7) Knowledge Translation in Research and 8) Knowledge Translation in Practice.

We thank <u>23 reviewers</u> from the arthritis community, researchers and consumer representatives, who will be providing their breadth of knowledge and expertise in arthritis research to evaluate the applications. Reviewers' expertise will help us select a winner from each of the award categories and acknowledge their great work in arthritis research. The awards will be presented to the winning applicants at the Gala dinner, at the AAC 2018 Annul Meeting, on Wednesday, November 21st in Toronto. *Thank you all for your great support in making this AAC program a successful effort once again!*

AAC Osteoarthritis (OA) Information Tool for Patients

Last year, the Arthritis Alliance of Canada (AAC) in partnership with the College of Family Physicians of Canada and the Centre for Effective Practice, developed and launched the Osteoarthritis (OA) Tool to help family doctors assist patients who have suspected, new or established OA of the hands, knees or hips. Earlier this year, a working group of the AAC, composed of representatives from patient-led or patient-focussed organizations and clinical and scientific experts in OA, was formed to develop a patient version of the Tool to assist those with or at risk of OA, in having better conversations with their doctor or other health care professional by informing them about the care they can expect to receive.

The working committee recently conducted a survey among the arthritis consumer community and stakeholders to help inform what key pieces of information from the original OA Tool for family doctors should also be included in the **OA Information Tool for Patients**. The working team received an overwhelming response to the survey questions, with 328 English responses and 94 French. The survey results are currently being analyzed and will assist in the development of this valuable resource. The final product is expected to be launched before the AAC Annual Meeting in November 2018.

The CANRAD Network team includes a variety of decision makers, epidemiologists, clinicians and researchers interested in the use of administrative data for rheumatic disease research. We held a CANRAD Network Meeting during the 2018 CRA Annual Scientific Meeting & AHPA Annual Meeting in Vancouver, BC and we will be organizing a CANRAD Network Webinar this fall! The CAnadian Network for Advanced Interdisciplinary Methods for comparative effectiveness research (CAN-AIM) objective is to respond to key knowledge gaps regarding drug safety and effectiveness by answering queries which arise from Health Canada and other regulatory parties. We are currently working with several enhanced cohorts, including PiMS, CATCH, CanHepC and GENESIS-PRAXY, as well as responding to a number of queries from Health Canada. Our

McGill University Health Centre



Interesting research projects are underway at the Research Institute of the McGill University Health Centre (RI MUHC), led by rheumatologist Dr. Evelyne Vinet. To improve strategies for health professionals counselling pregnant women with rheumatic disease, her team is conducting a focus group study assessing the clinical and psychosocial needs, barriers, and facilitators to pregnancy counselling in women with RA and SLE. She is also building the Lupus prEGnAnCY (LEGACY) cohort, a large, multi-

centre, international prospective cohort of SLE pregnancies, to evaluate adverse pregnancy outcomes, their predictors, and potential preventive therapies. A Canadian Initiative for Outcomes Research in Arthritis (CIORA) funded randomized controlled trial is underway assessing an educational tool for improving preeclampsia knowledge in pregnant women with SLE.
