AAC 2018 Research Awards Program: Update

We are in the process of finalizing the results of the AAC 2018 Research Awards round. The winners of the AAC 2018 Research Awards will be announced at the Annual Meeting Gala Dinner on Wednesday, November 21st, Toronto in recognition for their active engagement and outstanding contribution in arthritis research. Arthritis Alliance of Canada: Osteoarthritis (OA) Information Tool for Patients

Last year, the Arthritis Alliance of Canada (AAC) in partnership with the College of Family Physicians of Canada (CFPC) and the Centre for Effective Practice (CEP), developed and launched the Osteoarthritis (OA) Tool to help family doctors assist patients who have suspected, new or established OA of the hands, knees or hips. Earlier this year, a working group of the AAC, composed of representatives from patient-led or patient-focussed organizations and clinical and scientific experts in OA, was formed to develop a patient version of the Tool to assist those with or at risk of OA, in having better conversations with their doctor or other health care professional by informing them about the care they can expect to receive.

The working committee conducted a survey among the arthritis consumer community and stakeholders to help inform what key pieces of information from the original OA Tool for family doctors should also be included in the **OA Information Tool for Patients**. The working team received a strong response, that included 328 English and 94 French responses. The survey results were analyzed and assisted in the development of this valuable resource.

The initial draft of the Tool will be presented to AAC members and community at the AAC Annual Meeting on November 21-22, 2018 in Toronto. The final product will be launched soon after the meeting. Stay tuned!

Rapid Access Clinics (RACs)

Improved accessibility to better health outcomes is on the horizon for those affected with arthritis and musculoskeletal conditions (MSK). The Arthritis Society is supporting the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care in the expansion of MSK RACs across the province to all Local Health Integration Networks (LHINs). These clinics will provide services for patients with hip/knee osteoarthritis and low back pain. Patients referred to their local RAC for assessment will have access to imaging studies when appropriate and surgery when necessary, or they will be given a self-management plan with non-surgical measures and may be connected with local community supports. The 13th Annual Ankylosing Spondylitis International Federation (ASIF) Meeting



October 10th-13th the Canadian Spondylitis Association (CSA) attended the 13th annual Ankylosing Spondylitis International Federation (ASIF) meeting in Guangzhou China. Together with patient groups from around the world supporting those living with Ankylosing Spondylitis we shared, collaborated and celebrated our successes over the past 2 years.

Key themes discussed were the 8.5 average years to diagnosis and continued need to reduce this time, significance of comorbidity complications, importance of mental health and the role it has on outcomes and relevance and influence of social media campaigns. Countries from around the globe are closely aligned with many excellent ideas to support World Ankylosing Spondylitis day activities in

2019. ASIF is an excellent forum to learn and share. AS does not have borders.

The Legalization of Cannabis

October 17th marked the legalization of Cannabis for Canadians who want to use Cannabis for recreational purposes. Medical patients will be impacted by this legislation. It is strongly encouraged to use recreational Cannabis responsibly as medical cannabis patients will be impacted by the decisions of recreational users. Having said this the medical system continues to grow and new products will be available in new administration methods that are geared towards helping patients with their medical use. The CSA is committed to educating our community on the safe use of medical cannabis and reducing the stigma. Patients use Cannabis to medicate and not for the reasons of recreational users.

Celebrating the 1st Annual National Psoriatic Arthritis Day

October 19th. we celebrated the first annual National Psoriatic Arthritis day. In celebration, the CSA has partnered on two separate programs. October 17th, the CSA and Canadian Association of Psoriasis Patients (CAPP) held a one-hour twitter campaign with Dr. Arthur Lau to kick-off bringing awareness to PsA. #NewdayforPsA was created to drive this campaign. It is worth noting that Psoriatic Arthritis coupled with Psoriasis leads to almost certain Mental Health challenges. On October 19, the CSA, Arthritis Consumer Experts, Canadian Arthritis Patient Alliance, the Arthritis Society, CAPP and Canadian Psoriasis Network held an awareness campaign on twitter and facebook #cdnPSAday. Both campaigns were a great success.

PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCY OF CANADA

Canadian Chronic Disease Surveillance System (CCDSS) Data Tool

The 2018 edition of the <u>Canadian Chronic Disease Surveillance System (CCDSS) Data Tool</u> is now online! Using data from the CCDSS, this tool presents the latest statistics and trends over time on 20+ chronic diseases including **osteoarthritis**, **gout/crystal arthropathies**, **rheumatoid arthritis**, and **juvenile idiopathic arthritis** in Canada. The CCDSS is a collaborative network of provincial and territorial surveillance systems supported by the PHAC. It relies on linked health insurance registration files, physician billing claims, and hospital discharge abstracts.

The health insurance registries capture data on all residents who are eligible for provincial or territorial health insurance (about 97% of the Canadian population). Case definitions are applied to these linked databases and data are then aggregated at the provincial and territorial level before being submitted to the PHAC for reporting.



McGill University Health Centre



Interesting research projects are underway at the Research Institute of the McGill University Health Centre (RI MUHC), led by rheumatologist Dr. Evelyne Vinet. To improve strategies for health professionals counselling pregnant women with rheumatic disease, her team is conducting a focus group study assessing the clinical and psychosocial

needs, barriers, and facilitators to pregnancy counselling in women with RA and SLE. The first abstract for this study will be presented at the 2018 ACR. She is also building the Lupus prEGnAnCY (LEGACY) cohort, a large, multicentre, international prospective cohort of SLE pregnancies, to evaluate adverse pregnancy outcomes, their predictors, and potential preventive therapies.

A Canadian Initiative for Outcomes Research in Arthritis (CIORA) funded randomized controlled trial is underway assessing an educational tool for improving preeclampsia knowledge in pregnant women with SLE. Our Lupus Clinic is celebrating 40 years of research this fall! CAnadian Network for Advanced Interdisciplinary Methods (CAN-AIM)

The CAnadian Network for Advanced Interdisciplinary Methods for comparative effectiveness research (CAN-AIM) objective is to respond to key knowledge gaps regarding drug safety and effectiveness by answering queries which arise from Health Canada and other regulatory parties. We are currently working with several enhanced cohorts, including PiMS, CATCH, CanHepC and GENESIS-PRAXY, as well as responding to a number of queries from Health Canada. Our team has
