For Early Career Researchers/Faculty Member/Investigators: Applicants must be within the **first five (5) years of faculty appointment** as a faculty member/independent researcher.

- Early Career Researcher/Early Career Faculty Member/Investigator in **Health Science/Population Health**

For Knowledge Translation Researchers: Applicants must have made significant contributions to KT Research (Science) or KT (Practice) - dissemination and implementation activities in arthritis.

- A 1-page narrative letter that describes interest and enthusiasm for arthritis research, and relevant contributions and/or activities, outcomes, publications, reports, conference presentations, etc.
- A 1-page description of research project summarizing the following:
 - The gap in arthritis knowledge
 - How your research will address this gap; and
 - How the results of the research could lead to improving the lives of Canadians living with arthritis.

*****Please note:** Your narrative letter and description of a research project (1-page maximum/per each document), must be written in Times New Roman, 12-point font with 2.0 cm of margins.
